Course objective To provide knowledge and practical skills in understanding English texts in the field of biotechnology which are essential for developing students' communication skills (speaking and writing) .				
Learning outcomes The students acquire competences in language structure and lexis (grammar competence and vocabulary). Students are able to understand and analyze the English text in field of foot processing. Other important outcomes include students' capability of writing summaries of the English text, citing references found on the Internet, defining and explaining main concepts found in the English texts.				
Course contents Grammar (passive forms, infinitive, gerund, participles, modal verbs, subjunctive); morphological processes - compounds; lexical analysis (synonyms, antonyms, phrasal verbs, idioms); syntactic analysis (conditional clauses, relative clauses, clauses of purpose); text analysis; writing summaries and citing references; definitions and explanations of main concepts in the texts from the field of biotechnology; Texts: 1. Crops 2. Field crops 3. Horticultural plants 4. Fruit plants 5. Livestock 6. Microbiology and principles of hygiene 7. Ecosystems – structure and processes 8. Foods for human consumption 9. Chemical preservatives
