The aim of the course Diplomatic and consular law deepens students' knowledge on the system of norms/rules and institutions that applies in bilateral, diplomatic and consular relations; students are being introduced with functioning of multilateral diplomacy taking place at international conferences; the course provides basic knowledge on the rules of conference law.			
Course outcome: Students will be able to understand the rules governing diplomatic and consular relations; in practice, they will be able to ensure that the rules of Diplomatic and Consular Law are respected, but also to recognize different ways of violating it.			
Course content <i>Theoretical classes</i> : Origin, development, sources and modern codifications of Diplomatic and Consular Law; Head of State, Government and Prime Minister, Minister of Foreign Affairs; Representative bodies and their foreign policy functions; The concept and content of bilateral diplomacy; Diplomatic staff, functions, privileges and immunities; Multilateral diplomacy; The concept and types of Consular Services, functions, privileges and immunities. <i>Practical classes</i> : Exercises, Debate workshops (conceptualized in accordance to the demonstrated interest of attendees).
