<b>The aim of the course</b>			
Introductory notes of International Relations are being provided to the attendee. The course teaches on international security system, balance of power and collective security. The fundamentals of the science of International Relations are issues of war and peace, their causes, history and consequences. In that sense, the causes and consequences of some of the most significant wars in history, such as the First and Second World Wars, and the Cold War, are being addressed through the course. Attention will be also focused to the analysis of contemporary International Relations, as well as to the new challenges and threats.			
<b>Outcome of the case</b>			
Students will be able to use professional literature in this scientific field; to use the acquired knowledge on the basic categories from the theory and practice of International Relations in the proces of argumentation development as well as for the purpose of problem solving within the field of International Relations; to collect and interpret all data relevant in concerning area: - additional improvement of the ability of critical and self-critical thinking as well as to be able to proceed with advanced training in the field of Public International Law at Doctoral academic studies.

The concept, subject and method of the science of International Relations; Geopolitical understandings of International Relations; International systems: concept, history, structures and processes; Subjects (former and latter) of International Relations; Public International Law and morality in International Relations; Wars (old and new) in International Relations; Balance of power: concept, meaning, history, contradictions, perspectives; Collective security: concept, meaning, history, contradictions, perspectives; Power in International Relations; Conceptual foundations of the Cold War, Local armed conflicts during the Cold War, coups and revolutions; Establishing a new world order and continuation of the arms race, disarmament negotiations and global security; The Non-Aligned Movement during and after the Cold War; Local wars and coups after the fall of the Berlin Wall;
