<i>Theoretical teaching</i>				
The concept and importance of the principle of equality in the legal order; discrimination and prohibition of discrimination; types and forms of discrimination; means of protecting equality in the internal and international order; prohibition of discrimination in the Republic of Serbia; anti-discrimination legislation in the Republic of Serbia; the institution of the Commissioner for the Protection of Equality; jurisdiction, measures and procedure for the protection of equality before the Commissioner for Protection of Equality.				
<i>Practical teaching</i>				
Practical analysis of theoretical questions about discrimination, basic terms of the principle of prohibition of discrimination and their importance in the legal order; practical examples and training for writing petitions to the Commissioner for the Protection of Equality; improvisation of the proceedings before the Commissioner for the Protection of Equality; improvisation and drafting of acts adopted by the Commissioner for the Protection of Equality; understanding the relationship between petitions to the Commissioner for Protection of Equality and other legal means in the function of protection of equality (appeal, constitutional appeal); preparing for study-research work, taking colloquiums and exams; analysis of cases from the practice of the Commissioner for the Protection of Equality, the practice of the Constitutional Court of Serbia and the practice of the European Court for the Protection of Human Rights and Freedoms.
