<p>The course focuses on a detailed examination of International Public Law, aiming to familiarize students with the key sources within this legal domain. Emphasis is placed on understanding the unique characteristics of these sources, their hierarchical structure, and practical applications. The primary objective is accomplished through an in-depth analysis of landmark rulings from the International Court of Justice. This scrutiny encompasses various international agreements, customary practices, and overarching legal principles, highlighting their significance and characteristics. Noteworthy consideration is given to the doctrines and judicial protocols involved in resolving disputes. Additionally, the course delves into topics such as international law, state rights, obligations, and responsibilities, state succession, state recognition, and government recognition.</p>			
<p><b>The outcome of the course:</b> Upon completion of the course, participants will attain the necessary knowledge and skills to engage in critical analysis of a diverse array of topics within Public International Law. This will empower them to independently carry out research utilizing suitable literature and proper methodology.</p>			
<p><b>The content of the subject</b> covers in-depth study the following questions – Concept of the Public International Law; Origin and development of the Public International Law; Doctrine of the Public International Law; Relationship between national and Public International Law; Formal sources of the Public International Law; Subjects of the Public International Law; State; Recognition of the State and recognition of Government; Fundamental rights and obligations of the State; States jurisdiction in the international law; Responsibility of the State; Succession; Institutions competent for international relations; Multilateral diplomacy; State boundaries and international law; State territory; International Leases and Servitudes; International rivers; Maritime area; Air space; Polar regions; Cosmic (Outer) space; Law governing international contracts; International organizations; United Nations; Regional organizations; Specialized agencies; International human rights; International Criminal Law; Peaceful disputes settlement; Armed conflict under international law.</p>
